



### **Oregon IDA Initiative, Fall funding awards, October 31, 2013**

A total of \$1.2 million was awarded across the Oregon IDA Initiative. Seven awards were made in coordination with our Initiative Partner Organizations who manage networks of partners, and four awards were made to organizations directly.

#### *Awards made in coordination with CASA of Oregon's network:*

**Innovative Changes** \$60,000 (plus \$180,000 from existing capacity)

Serving at risk and minority youth in the Portland Metro area with education IDAs.

**Lower Columbia Hispanic Council** \$30,000 (plus \$90,000 from existing capacity)

Serving North Coast Community with education and microenterprise IDAs.

**MAPS Foundation** \$30,000 (plus \$90,000 from existing capacity)

Serving at risk and minority youth in the Marion County area.

#### *Awards made in coordination with NeighborWorks Umpqua's network:*

**Goodwill of Lane and South Coast Counties** \$30,000 (plus \$90,000 from existing capacity)

Program development and expansion to remove barriers to employment through assistive technology IDAs.

#### *Awards made in coordination with Mercy Corps Northwest:*

**Oregon Youth Authority** \$120,000

Serving youth in transitional housing within the OYA system.

#### *Awards made in coordination with Native American Youth and Family Center:*

**Metropolitan Family Services** \$75,000 (plus \$45,000 from existing capacity)

Education IDAs for low-income and minority families in tri-county Portland metro area.

**Self Enhancement, Inc.** \$75,000 (plus \$45,000 from existing capacity)

Education IDAs for minority youth in North and Northeast Portland.

#### **College Dreams** \$240,000

Gains Fiduciary Organization status and continues support of their IDA program serving youth with low-incomes in southern Oregon.

#### **NEDCO** \$220,000

Expands their program to include education and assistive technology in support of employment IDAs in Marion and Lane counties.

**Portland Housing Center \$200,000**

Outreach and support of underserved communities with homeownership IDAs in the tri-county Portland metro area.

**Warm Springs Community Action Team \$120,000**

IDAs in all asset classes for community members who live on or near the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Reservation.
